

Pupil Premium Funding
2016-2017 Spending Plan



As part of the Coalition Government’s policy to improve the educational attainment of under-performing pupils, additional funding has been allocated to schools through the Pupil Premium Grant (PPG).

This allocation (**£1320 per qualifying pupil**) is based on the number of pupils in Reception to Year 6, who have been registered for free school meals at any point in the last six years (known as ‘Ever 6 FSM’) as recorded on the termly census. Looked After Children (LAC), who comply with the looked after children criteria, also receive an allocation of £1900.

Accountability

The school decides how to use the Pupil Premium Funding and is held accountable for the decisions they make through:

- the performance tables which show the performance of disadvantaged pupils compared with their peers
- the new Ofsted inspection framework, under which inspectors focus on the attainment of pupil groups, in particular those who attract the Pupil Premium
- the new reports for parents that schools now have to publish online
